

Excerpt from the Taekwondo Canada NCCP Operations Manual

- 2.1. As part of the development of coach education Taekwondo Canada must recommend requirements for instructors and coaches whose athletes and / or participants compete in recreational or competitive tournaments. This legislation will be phased in as coaching contexts are developed.
- 2.2. Legislative recommendations are outlined in Table 2.2-A and identifies when minimum licensing will take effect. Individuals who coach participant in a certain stage of LTAD or Program will be required to obtain an applicable license
 - 2.2.1. Individuals who attain trained status will be granted a license for a minimum validity identified in the table
 - 2.2.2. Individuals who attain certified status license will be granted an ongoing license that would need to be maintained based on NCCP minimum standards.

- 2.3. Licenses will be issued by Taekwondo Canada and requires the following procedures
 - 2.3.1. Coach / Instructor to apply for license online (Taekwondo Canada)
 - 2.3.2. Coach / Instructor qualifications verified by Taekwondo Canada
 - 2.3.3. Coach / Instructor issued applicable license or recommendation to make up missing qualifications.
- 2.4. Regulating licensing will be the responsibility of the organization delivering a particular type of program, and may have greatest impact for coaches in competitions.
 - 2.4.1. Provincial / regional organizations should develop strategies and policies to ensure reasonable adherence to Taekwondo Canada minimum legislative standards.
 - 2.4.2. Taekwondo Canada will regulate licensing at nationally sanctioned events. Taekwondo Canada through the NCCP operations committee will make recommendations regarding the regulation of licensing. (Considering a reward rather than a punitive system).
